COMMUNITY COUNCIL MEETING REPORT: NOVEMBER

The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance followed by introductions of all present - total 29, including guests. The police report was given by Sgt. Ploehs, our neighborhood liaison, at which time most of the discussion centered around keeping yourself and property safe by not leaving cars running in the winter, adding home cameras, calling the non-emergency number when you see something not normal, and registering cameras with the police to help with crime prevention.

In the past few weeks we have seen two disturbing shooting incidents in the neighborhood: one on Orient involving a drug dealer from outside SGV and the other a dispute shooting on N. Edgewood. We also had a late-night police chase through the neighborhood resulting in a crash into the Constant Care Daycare at E. Epworth & N. Edgewood involving a juvenile in a stolen car. We then broke into small groups to talk about our safety concerns and discussed ideas that we could pursue to improve our neighborhood safety, including more activities for kids, traffic routing, adding community cameras, motion detector lights, etc. Stay tuned for more planned action regarding neighborhood safety.

We then heard from guest, Ms. Eve Bolton from the Board of Education. She spoke about the CANS neighborhood school and the progress being made this year. She also spoke about the CPS 2020 Vision Plan to help with equity education and diversity, and the restoration of programs to give our children more choices for their futures (i.e. Future Teachers of America).

There was an appeal for more community involvement and help with our SGV 2.0 Neighborhood Plan and promoting the next meeting. We then voted for our 2020 Community Council Board. All nominees were elected for a one-year term.
